H. (Henk) J.M. Bos is Extraordinary Professor of History of Mathematics; he is affiliated to the Department of History and Foundations of Mathematics and Science of Utrecht University. His current research focuses on the concept of construction and the representation of curves in 16th–18th century mathematics.

Dr. **Elly Dekker** has published on several subjects in the history of astronomy. She is preparing a book on astronomy in the nineteenth century.

R. Hooykaas, retired, was Professor of History of Science at Utrecht University. He is completing at present a reworked edition of the Gifford Lectures he gave some time ago.

Frank Huisman is a Ph.D. student at the Free University at Amsterdam. He is writing a thesis on medical history of the town of Groningen, 1600–1800.

Dick van Lente is Assistant Professor of Cultural History of Industrialized Societies at Erasmus University, Rotterdam. He has recently completed his Ph.D. thesis, *Techniek en ideologie. Opvattingen over de maatschappelijke betekenis van technische vernieuwingen in Nederland, 1850–1920* ('Technology and ideology. Opinions about the social implications of technological innovations in the Netherlands').

Lambertus Okken is Associate Professor of Medieval German Language and Literature at Utrecht University. He has published several books and articles in this field.

Theo Verbeek is Assistant Professor of History of Modern Philosophy at Utrecht University. He wrote a Ph.D. thesis on La Mettrie's *Traité de l'Ame*. He presently studies the history of mechanical philosophy, especially Dutch Cartesianism, and has recently published *La Querelle d'Utrecht* (Paris, 1988), a collection of documents connected with Descartes' polemics with Voetius.

André Wegener Sleeswyk is Professor of Applied Physics at the University of Groningen. His research interests are physical metallurgy, and the history of technology. He has published research papers on both subjects.
